Parking

On street parking around the perimeter of Sefton park.

Accessible Parking

There are limited disabled parking spaces available on a first come first served basis situated at the Aigburth Vale car park. This is for Blue badge holders only.

City of Light, City of Sanctuary

How long does it take to go around City of Light, City of Sanctuary?

The installation illuminated and soundscape running from 5pm to 9pm each night. You can stay as long as you like - The lantern city installation is accompanied by an epic soundscape which is populated by real life stories, memories

and poems from well over a hundred Liverpool residents involved in City of Light's community outreach writing project. It could take anything from twenty minutes to one hour of listening, looking and experiencing the event.

Seeing the floating city is free, but we need your support and you can help support it by donating through our crowd funder page, buying a lantern, and giving to our collectors on the night.

Is there a route? There will be a one-way flow around the lake which will be stewarded

Is the event accessible?

Both Habitats and City of Light, City of Sanctuary installations are wheelchair accessible. Please contact us with any specific access questions.

Toilets

There are accessible toilets in the Aviary Café and Boating Lake Kiosk in Sefton Park

Food/drinks

Food and refreshments will be available at the Park Café's and at Food and Drink stalls above the lake.

Weather

This is an outdoor winter event, so please come warmly dressed for the weather conditions, including suitable footwear.

Habitats at Sefton Park Palmhouse

Entrance point to Palmhouse: The entrance for Habitats is via the West Gate (ie **NOT** the usual main entrance). On entering Park from either the Boating Lake or Café side, just follow the festoon lighting to the Palmhouse

How long does it take to see Habitats?

Habitats takes place within the grounds of Sefton Park Palm house which is a fairly small contained area. You can stay as long as you want at Habitats, but you must stick to your allocated ticket time to enter. On average, we estimate a visit would take 20-30 mins.

The Palm House is connected to the lake by a short well-lit walk through the park.

Can I bring a dog? Dogs are not allowed in the Palmhouse Gardens

Habitats story trail at the Palm House – booking tickets is essential

Cost: £6 per person plus booking fee. Under 2 year olds can enter free of charge. Please book your free under 2's ticket when booking

Habitats Ticket time slots

You will need to choose your ticket time slot.

Entrance times are at 15 minute intervals from 5.00pm – 8.30pm(Habitats closes at 9pm).

How long does it take to experience the Habitats trail?

Approx. 20-30 mins.

Do I need to buy a ticket for my baby?

Tickets are needed for all children aged 2 years old and over. Under 2's are free. You will need to book your free ticket for under 2's whilst booking your own ticket.

Queuing

We endeavour to make the whole experience as fun and enjoyable as possible for all! Please arrive at your allotted time to help us avoid unnecessary entrance delays and congestion. Please allow plenty of time for car parking and/or walking from any of the entrances to Sefton Park.
